Wi-Fi POLICY

By accessing the Edward F. Owen Memorial Library Wireless Internet Service, you agree to follow the library's Internet and Computer Usage policies. The Edward F. Owen Memorial Library provides public access to the Internet in keeping with its role of providing equal access to information to meet the educational and informational needs of the community of Carter Lake. The library has no control over the information on the Internet and is not responsible for its content. As is the case with other materials in the library's collection, any restrictions of a child's access to the Internet is the responsibility of the parent or guardian.

Anyone who brings personal computer equipment into the Edward F. Owen Memorial Library to use the library WI-FI should sign in at the circulation desk and agree to follow all rules and regulations stated in the library's Computer Usage Policy. This policy applies to all library and non-library computers and electronic equipment used in the Edward F. Owen Memorial Library.

Although patrons using the Internet are free to access any site, it is unacceptable to send, receive, or display text or graphics which may reasonably be construed as obscene.

Patrons using their own equipment must sit at a library table, not designated reading areas, i.e., Teen Central, Children's Area or Adult Reading Area sections of the library.

Patrons must use headphones when listening to audio files in the library.

The patron is responsible for supplying charged batteries.

The library does not supply printing on the wireless network.

Library staff will not be able to provide assistance on a patron's personal computer.

If you are using your computer in a manner that is inconsiderate of others, a staff member may ask you to end your session.

Illegal conduct will be reported immediately to the police and will result in the suspension of library privileges.
